Looking at the latest evidence, examples and case studies from some of the many local authorities who have already adopted the approach of single handed care, this is an opportunity to explore potential barriers and/or resistance to a new way of thinking and practising, as well as solutions to the current challenges and pathways from an integrated perspective across all sectors of health and social care.

Now is the time to introduce this thinking within the NHS and encourage a joined-up approach to embed and sustain practice within whole systems. This workshop will be a great opportunity for delegates to find out more and consider the possibilities for themselves.
