It aims to create a space to showcase and share ideas, network, and discuss the topics which matter with people who share your research interests. The conference has been designed for safeguarding professionals, postgraduates and early career researchers who operate within the broad remits of safeguarding adult and children.

We welcome abstracts of **up to 250 words** on any topics related to the study of adult and child safeguarding, for example, practice, policy, and law, from MA students, PhD and Prof Doc students, and early career researchers who are up to two years post-viva. The event will consist of presentations from guest speakers (15 minutes each in length) with time for questions and answers, separated by a talk from guest speakers to facilitate group discussion.
